Memories of 2025 year



We have long dreamed for a space where it would be convenient to share with you all the most important things: children's stories, reports, news and projects.

In 2025 it became possible! Our new website— it is significant step towards greater openness, transparency and interaction with you. As the result - more people will learn about good deeds. After all, each of us make changes possible.



In May 2025 detdom.info took part in the Career Festival, which was held at VDNH in Kyiv.

This gave us the opportunity to find new partners, volunteers, to draw attention to our activities. Emphasis was placed on three projects:

1. "Successful start." We have established cooperation with employers who are ready to hire and intern project graduates;
2. "Mentoring". Had the greatest demand. About 200 people received mentoring advice during the 4 days of the festival and were referred to the Centers of Social Services for Family and Youth Affairs;
3. "Corporate Volunteering." A lecture-training was held on the topic: "Corporate Volunteering: Where to Start?", where executives and HR managers of large businesses received valuable knowledge on implementing the project in their companies.



PROJECT «SUCCESSFUL START»



The project involves teenagers from families with difficult life circumstances, large families, incomplete families, graduates of boarding schools, who study in colleges and vocational education institutions. Helping teenagers in these categories is extremely important, because during this period personality, life values and self-confidence are formed.

What gives participation in project:

- ☛ Equal opportunities for start in life

Not all teenagers have access to high-quality education, clubs, technology or adult support.

We give the chance to reveal potentials.

- ☛ Preventions of social risks

Supported teenagers are less likely to get into dangerous situations, addictions, violence or crime. Taking care of themselves today is preventing problems tomorrow.

- ☛ Psychological support and values formation

In difficult circumstances, children often feel “invisible.” We show them that they are important, their dreams matter and there are adults around who care.

- ☛ Investment in future

An educated, self-confident teenager grows up to be a responsible citizen who can contribute to the development of the country.

- ☛ Break circles of poverty

Support in adolescence helps to change the life scenario and avoid repeating difficulties of family's bad patterns.

- ☛ Mutual support

When children see examples of kindness and support, they themselves grow up to be people ready to help others.

In the first half of 2025, 124 children participated in the project, in the second - 101 young people became participants. During their participation in the project, all participants received financial support in the form of a monthly scholarship of 23 USD (230 USD per academic year*). The total amount of scholarship support within the framework of this project provided in 2025 amounted to 24 600 USD.

The scholarship has a specific purpose and is used to cover the basic needs of participants, including the purchase of food and medicines, payment for mobile communications and the Internet, as well as transportation costs.

In addition to financial support, project participants received the necessary logistical support, which contributed to their training, development and everyday safety:

*scholarship paid within 10 months (September- June)

- 95 children were provided with power banks and others gadgets;
- 17 participants received graduation and concert dresses;
- 11 children were provided with food sets;
- 83 boys and girls received stationery;
- 14 young people were provided with materials for their internship.

In addition, other individual support was provided . In particular, some participants used medical services within the framework of the "Right to Health" project.

An important part of the work has been constant communication with the children. Most of them need not only material assistance, but also the support of an adult mentor - a person who can listen, give advice and help in solving every day and personal issues. That is why the coordinators of detdom.info supported regular connections with each child, providing timely support and guidance.





In 2025, much attention was paid to the development of professional skills of our participants. Students of the Kyiv Professional College of Technology and Clothing Design, who are studying to be tailors, received 2 sewing machines, 2 overlockers and fabrics, and students of the Nizhyn College of Culture and Arts, future musicians were given 2 banduras, 2 guitars and 3 bayans. This will give an opportunity for students to better master their chosen profession, practice

skills during training, reveal their creative potentials and more confidently build a professional future. Providing modern tools and equipment not only increases the level of training of young people but also motivates them to self-development, persistent labor and faith in own strengths. We are convinced that such support is an important step towards developing competitive specialists and creating real opportunities for their successful self-realization.



«Practice does master!»

A person becomes a master through their own efforts, patience and the opportunity to apply skills in practice. This is especially important for young people: when there is access to tools, equipment and real tasks, talent has chance to outgrow in real profession. Therefore within the framework of the "Successful Start" project a significant part is devoted to master classes, trainings, workshops, everything that allows children to consolidate and expand their knowledge of their future profession.

Project «Family needs help»



Helping families in difficult life circumstances — is not charity"from "I regret it", but a necessary condition for the protection of children, stability of society and development of the state.

According to Ministry of social policy and Children's services: before the full-scale war (2021), more than 400 thousand families were registered who found themselves in complex vital circumstances (CVC).

Over 600,000 children were raised in these families. After 2022, the number of such families have increased significantly due to the war. According to estimates by social services and international organizations more than 1 million families may be in the CVC.

By helping families who find themselves in difficult life circumstances, we address the following issues:

1. **Prevention of social Orphanage.** Majority children in institutional care facilities have living parents. Supporting families in crisis helps keeping the child in the family;
2. **Breaking the cycle of poverty.** Difficult life circumstances are often passed on from generation to generation. Timely help gives parents a chance to regain their ability to work, allows children to get an education and a profession. This is an investment in the independence of the family, not a maintenance;
3. **Social stability and secure society.** Disregarding of the problems of such families leads to: increasing homelessness, increasing crime rates, deteriorating mental health of the population;
4. **Moral responsibility and values.** Attitude towards the weakest is an indicator of the maturity of a society;
5. **Of particular relevance for Ukraine today.** The war has significantly increased the number of families in crisis: IDPs, military families, families with the loss of a breadwinner. Helping them means: supporting those who suffered the most, the restoration of the country through the support of the people, the contribution to the future of post-war Ukraine.

Also, within the framework of the project "Family Needs Help", comprehensive support and assistance is provided to family-type orphanages. After all, supporting family-type orphanages is extremely important, as they are the closest to natural family environment and corresponds the best interests of child.





First, family-type orphanages provide children with stability, care, and emotional security. Children who have lost parental care for various reasons have the opportunity to live in a family where they are communicated with, supported, and their individual needs are taken into account, rather than being placed in a boarding school.

Secondly, upbringing in a family environment contributes to harmonious psychological and social child development. In such families, children learn to

build relationships, trust adults, take responsibility for their own actions and prepare for independent living. Thirdly, family-type orphanages help reduce the social isolation of orphans and children deprived of parental care. They integrate into the community, attend regular schools, clubs, communicate with peers and feel like full members of society.

Children who grow up in an atmosphere of love and support have a better chance of becoming self-sufficient, responsible, and socially active citizens.

So, by supporting family-type orphanages, we are not only helping specific children today, but also shaping a healthy, humane, and responsible society tomorrow.

Our military are incredible, they protect our peace every day, our sleep every difficult night, they work overtime in life-threatening conditions, they risk their lives every time, they themselves need support - but despite everything, they want to take care of the little ones Ukrainians - about orphans, creating an unforgettable holiday for them!

On the eve of St. Nicholas Day, servicemen battalion unmanned Systems A 4808 of the 141st Separate Mechanized Brigade visited three family-type orphanages with valuable gifts and goodies:



1. DBST Halilyuk, Kryviy Rig (after deoccupation moved from Beryslav city, Kherson region)
2. DBST Ivanchenko, Rivne (moved with the approach of the front from the Synelnyky district of the Dnipropetrovsk region).
3. DBST Molar, Kyiv region.

The orphanages received a printer, mini-electric substations, portable LED lamps, and other gifts. The children were endlessly delighted with the opportunity to communicate live with real heroes, receive gifts, souvenirs and a national flag with the heroes' autographs!

Holy Nikolay, protect our Ukrainian children and our invincible warriors!

In 2025 year our team provided help to 83 families with 424 children:

- food (115 children);
- charging stations/lights (16 children);
- clothing (45 children);
- books (21 children);
- stationery (119 children);
- medicines (16 children);
- baby food/diapers (9 children);
- toys/holiday gifts(65 children);
- gadgets for learning (18 children).



Project «Right for health»



The humanitarian project "Right to Health" is aimed at ensuring access to quality medical care for the most vulnerable categories of children, in particular: orphans, children deprived of parental care, children raised in foster families and family-type orphanages, as well as children returned from the temporarily occupied territories of Ukraine.

In 2025, the main target group of the project became children returned from temporarily occupied territories (TOT). While being on occupied territories, Ukrainian

children had deprived rights on complete medical services and access to primary and routine medical care. Receiving medical services is possible only in emergency cases or on a paid basis, which makes timely treatment and prevention of diseases impossible.

During 2025, 65 children were treated within the framework of the project. The coordinators of detdom.info organized 190 visits to 18 medical centers and clinics of various profiles in the regional centers of Ukraine:

- ophthalmology (7 visits);
- neurology+ EEG research(5 visits);
- dentistry (160 visits);
- blood tests (8 visits);
- pediatrician consultations (2 visits);
- otolaryngology (8 visits).

As in previous years, in 2025 the most popular area of medical care remained dentistry with 160 visits that testifies about significant need children in systemic dental treatment after a long stay without access to medical services.

As part of the implementation of the humanitarian project "Right to Health", the team of detdom.info coordinators systematically performed a coordination function between patients and medical institutions, ensuring access of children from vulnerable categories to complex and specialized medical care.

Description of complex clinical cases

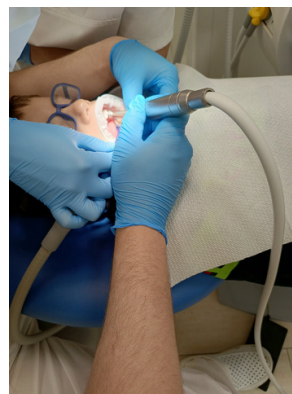


One of the most complex clinical cases was the case of 4-year-old Serhiy D., returned from the temporarily occupied part of Zaporizhzhia region. The child has congenital atrioventricular block and needed urgent pacemaker replacement. Cardiosurgical team of the National Children's Hospital "Okhmatdyt" was ready to perform surgery, but before the operation a deep wound was discovered caries and multiple inflammatory

processes (pulpitis) in 16 teeth, which made it impossible to perform cardiac surgery without prior dental treatment.

After a series of consultations, the ESTE-LINE clinic took on the responsibility of providing assistance. Based on the results of an interdisciplinary consultation of dentists from the ESTE-LINE clinic and cardiac surgeons from the Ohmatdyt National Dental Hospital, a decision was made to perform dental treatment under sedation with the involvement of a mobile resuscitation team and the possibility of immediate cardiac pacing in case of complications. The treatment was successful: all affected teeth were treated in one session. A month after the dental intervention, the child had a successful pacemaker replacement surgery.

Another example of effective cooperation was the provision of dental care to 5-year-old Timofey — from children's family-type house of the Peresenchuk family. Thanks to the assistance of the head of the clinic "Professor's Dentistry Lyubchenko" Oleksiy Oleksandrovych Lyubchenko, a full range of dental treatment was provided. The child had multiple dental lesions, which demanded comprehensive dental intervention.



A separate area within the project was dental treatment of children with autism spectrum disorders (ASD), developmental disorders, and limited mobility using the sedation method. Such interventions were carried out at the "Center for Family Dentistry" in Mykolaiv under the leadership of the head physician Iryna Oleksandrivna Bezushko, who specializes in performing complex dental operations for children with disabilities and developmental disabilities.

In 2025 year Mrs. Irina provided complex dental treatment of two teenagers with disabilities and special needs, returned from the temporarily occupied Left Bank of the Kherson region: 16-year-old Anna P. and 17-year-old Dmytro G., which significantly improved their health and quality of life.

Project «Volunteer movement»

Trips to children



Volunteers of Kmytivskaya boarding schools whole year have not neglected their duties. This group systematically and regularly visits their wards despite the difficulties with organizing trips and logistics. The constant, reliable and sincere presence of adults helps children grow up psychologically healthy and ready for independent life.

Systematic and regular visits to children in residential institutions are extremely important for several reasons:

- ☛ **Forming a sense of stability and security:** regular meetings with the same adults help children feel the predictability and reliability of the world;
- ☛ **Preventing emotional "swings":** holiday visits with gifts cause a strong rise in emotions, but after the guests leave, children often experience a sharp decline - sadness, disappointment, a feeling of abandonment;
- ☛ **Development of trust and healthy relationships:** When adults are coming not only "on holiday", but also for communication, learning, support, children learn to build lasting relationships and not associate attention only with gifts or entertainment;
- ☛ **Formation of realistic perception of the world:** regular everyday meetings are preparing children to real life, teaching interaction, responsibility, communication skills and independence.

We support orphanages

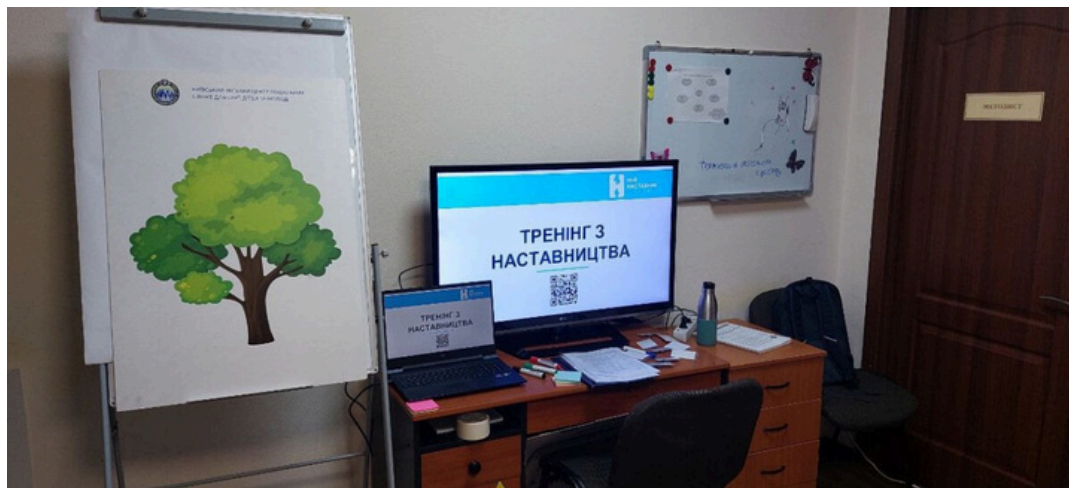
The volunteer group of the Nizhyn orphanage has been supporting the institution for almost 20 years. The orphanage is home to children and young people with disabilities aged 4 to 35 who require increased attention and a careful, professional approach.

After some of the residents were transferred to the Kozeletsk Geriatric Boarding House, volunteer activities were not stopped. Support is provided to both institutions, that allows to save on going social connections and provide continuity assistance ward.

In order to improve the emotional state of the children and support their psycho-emotional well-being during martial law, volunteers initiated a fundraising campaign to purchase an acoustic speaker. After the store owner learned about the intended purpose of equipment - it was provided free.



Project «Mentoring»



Mentoring is based on the personal involvement of an adult in the life of an individual child in helping them "build their own bridge" to real adult life.

Children raised in institutions are different, their skills and knowledge are significantly different from children raised in a family. They simply do not know how to cook meals on their own, buy food, things and generally do not know how to manage personal finances. And they also often do not understand what profession to choose in the future, how to achieve success.

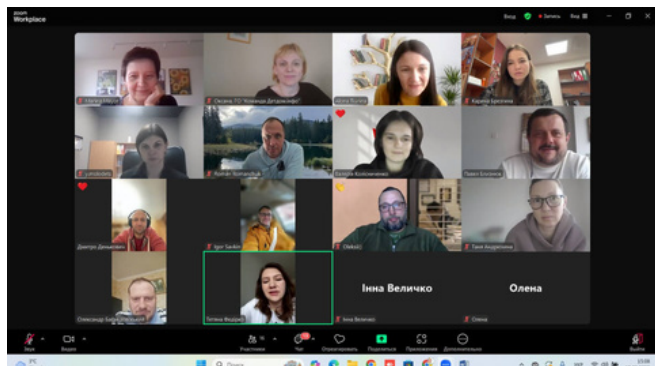
In December 2025, the Law "On Mentoring" was adopted - a document that defines the legal and organizational principles of state policy in the field of mentoring. This law is a logical step in the implementation of the Strategy for Ensuring the Right of Every Child to Grow Up in a Family Environment for 2024-2028, in particular, its strategic goal 5 - establishing social ties for the successful integration of children and youth into the life of communities. Prior to the adoption of the law, the regulation on mentoring, approved by Resolution No. 465 of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine dated 04.07.2017, was in force. It can be noticed that similar projects

"Mentorship" and "My Friend" have been implemented by different volunteer organizations with the team of detdom.info since 2009.

Since 2017, within the framework of this project we have actively collaborated with the Kyiv City and Regional social service centers. During 2025, our coaches on the basis of the Kyiv City Center for Social Services and Education have conducted numerous trainings on the training of mentors. Also in November 2025, we took participation in the forum "Development of mentoring as a social services in the territorial community of the city of Kyiv" where we presented our own experience, talked with colleagues and exchanged experiences.



Project «Corporate volunteering»



The corporate volunteer program is an effective tool that helps to strengthen corporate spirit, microclimate improvement in team, introducing partnerrelationships and building a positive reputation for the company as a whole.

The main goals of corporate volunteering are:

- ✎ support socially important projects;
- ✎ development cultures of responsibility and mutual aid;
- ✎ enhance team spirit;
- ✎ formation and strengthening positive company image.

The detdom.info team has started implementing a corporate volunteering since 2013 year, having seen in this direction considerable potential and long-term perspectives. During all those years of our activities a big number of volunteer teams in dozens of commercial companies were prepared united by a common desire to help children.

With the beginning of full-scale invasion, the project's activity naturally decreased, as most businesses focused their efforts on the priority area - supporting the Armed Forces of Ukraine.



In 2025, Detdom.info training center held the first online training on corporate volunteering "Help Correctly" for employees of the Multiplex company.

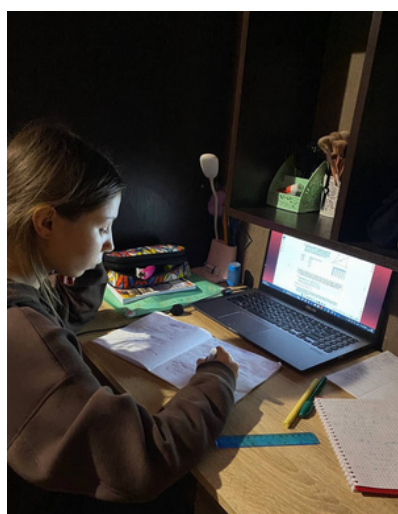
PJSC "Multiplex-Holding" is the largest cinema chain in Ukraine, founded in 2004, providing modern cinema screenings using IMAX and ScreenX technologies. The company's management systematically supports initiatives aimed at the development of society and the prosperity of Ukraine. During the training, future volunteers received thorough knowledge about the peculiarities of the development of children who grow up and are raised in institutions, their experience of socialization, the level of formation of life skills and needs at different stages of personality formation. Special attention was paid to the reasons why graduates of boarding schools often do not possess basic household skills and financial literacy. Participants also learned how to prevent loss of motivation and emotional burnout and how to maintain their own volunteer resource.

After that training, newly prepared volunteers immediately visited two institutions:

- District orphanage "Ridny Dim" of the Zolochiv district council of Lviv region
- Center for Social and Psychological Rehabilitation of Children of the Poltava Regional Council.

Trips to the chain's cinemas, as well as volunteer trips to institutions, took place systematically throughout the year, which allowed for the formation of stable and trusting relationships between adults and children by the end of the reporting period.

Project «I want to study»



"I Want to Study" project is being implemented to provide educational support to children raised in family-type orphanages and is aimed at bridging the gaps in assimilation of school knowledge and improvement of the level of mastery of basic academic disciplines by organizing additional individual lessons with tutors.

The project participants are:

- children who have recently been placed in family type orphanages (DBST) and need assistance from tutors for the fastest adaptation to the new environment,
- DBST children who are students of 9–11 grades and need help for preparation to drafting STA and NMT tests.

Project provides to such children possibility to get high-quality educational preparations despite their limited financial resources.

1 half of 2025 year



During the first half of the 2025 season, 25 participants from 10 family-type orphanages from the Kyiv region took part in the project, Rivne region, Kirovohrad region, Dnipropetrovsk region. Children mastered knowledge of mathematics (algebra, geometry), Ukrainian, English. The selection of teachers was carried out in place of the residence of child participant. (Also the project involved 5 children with disabilities who were trained in special simplified educational programs). The format of classes depends on the region and was mainly individual face-to-face but a blended type of online learning was also allowed. "on-line"- "off-line" (in the Dnipropetrovsk region, due to the proximity of the front line, training was conducted only remotely).

All children improved their knowledge, but the highest progress was seen in the younger school-age children recently placed in DBST: Maksym, 4th grade student class (DBST Solomakha in Kyiv region) – + 4 points/year with mathematicians and + 6 - with Ukrainian language and Zakhar, a 1st grade student from DBST Shevchenko (Kirovohrad region) with level progress +7-8 points/year.



2 half of 2025 year

In the second half of 2025, in agreement with the sponsors, we decided to change the project format and introduced online training for all participants. This decision was made due to the worsening security situation: an increase in the number of alarms, a deterioration in the energy situation in the country and pricing policies and level of professional teaching of educational disciplines. Therefore it was decided to choose an online school with a convenient schedule and demo access. As a result of the monitoring, an agreement was concluded with the online school "Study Online" for further education of children.

In the second half of 2025 year 27 children from 12 DBSTs (including 4 participants - children with disabilities from DBST Bondar for whom full-time education under a simplified program remained) took participation in the project. The list of subjects that children could additionally study at their choice was expanded. Number of subjects for primary / secondary school students classes remained on levels two and for that participants who are preparing to entry after grades 9-11, students were given the opportunity to choose three subjects to successfully pass the tests. Total duration of classes was 8 hours in 1 month.



During three months of additional trainings, participants improved their knowledge on firm "1" in some cases "2" points. Wonderful Stepan's results (3rd grade, DBST Maslo) in both mathematics and Ukrainian languages. Stepan in 3 months could improve his level from sufficient to high, approximately 2-3 points in each subject. Nikita (10th grade, DBST Vedernikova) also made high progress. Having a low initial level in mathematics, due to gaps in school education, he has quickly mastered new material and has already improved the subject by "+2" points and he also really enjoys studying English. He currently has a solid level of A1-A2, with the goal of A2 B1 (the initial level was A0- A1).

The best achievements

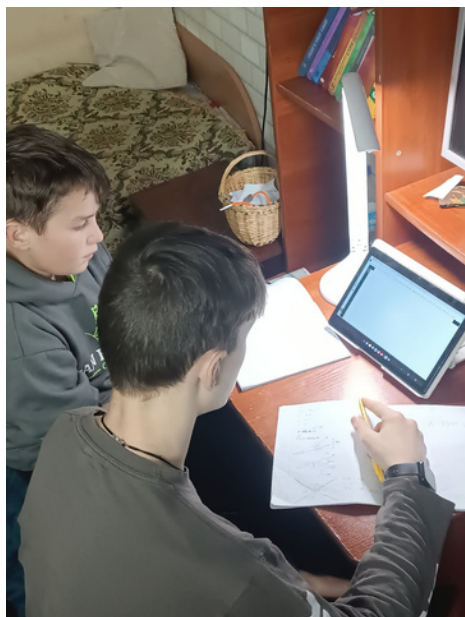
Thanks to project "I want to study", 11th grader Kateryna (DBST Dziuba) from front-line village of Marganets in the Dnipropetrovsk region was able to study English with a teacher in an online format. The child graduated from school with honors and entered a linguistic university. Girls from DBST Peresenchuk pulled up whole year mathematics and additional classes allowed 11th graders Victoria without obstacles pass necessary testing for entry on specialty "Jeweler".

Four children from the Molyar Secondary School, who participated in the "I Want to Study" project, graduated with high scores in school and entered higher vocational schools and colleges.

Reviews:

Valentine Drozdova, Ukrainian language teacher:

- Oksana (10th grade, DBST Daricescu): "Oksana has progressed not only in knowledge in three months of work, but, in my opinion, she has found an conversation partner with whom she can share the girl's diary that she painted: carols, congratulations, plans and dreams for the future. The girl regularly attends classes and if she asks to postpone, she does so in advance. During classes worked hard difference simple sentence from complex (although at first it was problem), knows how to find the grammatical basis of a sentence, practiced defining words as parts of speech. Several lessons were devoted to phraseological units and paronyms. Also, 2 lessons were festive - they opened game cells and performed linguistic exercises. Oksana works without a camera, cannot show the screen and cannot take remote control of my screen, because she works from her phone. I can definitely assure you that these classes are interesting for her, she attends them systematically, works willingly. It is difficult for her, but there is progress".



Olga Barchuk, Ukrainian language teacher:

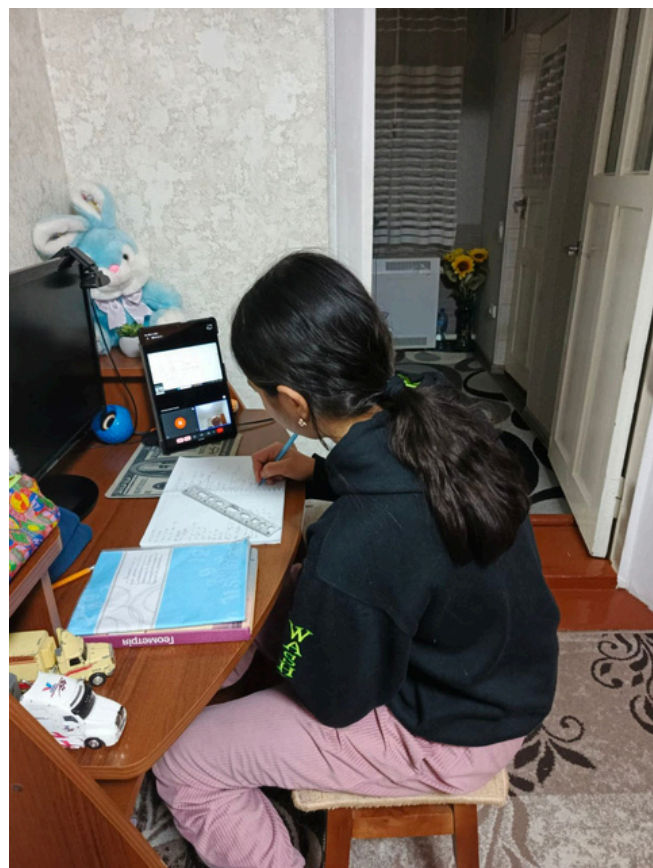
- Anna (10th grade, DBST Molyar): "We pull up at the same time school curriculum and preparing for the NMT. Where the topics are more difficult, it takes more time for Anya to understand. She tries, solves. It seems to me that Anya has become more confident in answering, expressing her opinion. As for the assessment of the school course, you can also assess the level of knowledge at 7-8 points. And for the NMT, I'm sure, she will still prepare".
